"We all have bad days, it makes good days feel better"


What witnesses do about bullying is actually one of the most important factors in stopping the bullying.

Elsewhere some of Year 7 have been working on the theme of bullying in Drama lessons. They spent time creating freeze images exploring different acts of bullying and talking about the impact it can have.



Year 8 have had the launch of a special version on the Howell's Award called Being Divergent where they are developing qualities as part of their character education programme. One area is kindness and Year 8 are logging where they have demonstrated shown kindness and caring to others.

Kindness Champions

One of the most important changes that has happened as part of our anti-bullying campaign is the introduction of Kindness Champions. All students had a chance to nominate people in their forms to stand up against bullying and to promote kindness in our words and actions.

These champions will now receive anti-bullying training and they will become the School Council for this year working with the Leadership Team.

- **Purpose of the role – every class will have someone who is there to raise awareness of being kind and thoughtful to each other and to support the school in challenging bullying**
- **Meetings of the Kindness Champions will take place every half term with the Leadership Team**
- **They will have a key role to play in making our school say no to bullying and to spread this message in assemblies and around the school**
