

A Digital Language Laboratory

Today we are global citizens, competing for jobs with people from all over the world, many of whom speak more than one language. Language skills can no longer be regarded as an optional extra to a well-equipped society. Rather, they are a key indicator of how willing and prepared we are to operate in an increasingly multilingual and multicultural world.

Languages stretch the imagination and the world view of students as they learn, developing core skills of communication and empathy alongside their knowledge and understanding of the language itself. Beyond Howell's, knowledge of another language opens up doors to new opportunities. It gives the ability to live and work internationally, and to interact with other nationalities and cultures.

The Modern Foreign Languages team at Howell's is a department of vibrant, experienced and enthusiastic multi-linguists who specialise in teaching French, Spanish and Welsh. Whilst using proven traditional techniques, we also like to integrate the latest technology into our teaching to ensure all students have the right balance of speaking and listening activities.

With the Sanako 700 Digital Language Laboratory, students from Year 3 up to Year 13 will take part in live role play activities, describing images, telephone simulation and many other activities all under the control of the teacher. The unique voice insert technology allows students to work independently on question and answer activities or even practice their translation and interpretation skills.


