Remembering Martha

Many of you will know who Martha Pugh was, but families who have only recently joined us at Howell's may never have heard her name. Martha arrived at Howell's when she was three years old, skipping into the playground, brown curls bouncing. In January 2017 Howell's lost one of its brightest stars when Martha died just after her 13th birthday, after six years of treatment for cancer. Martha will remain forever a Howell's girl, and her parents Bec and Paul, as well as her baby sister Maud, remain very involved with the school.

In assemblies next week, Martha's friends, who are now in Year 12, will be talking to students from Nursery to Year 12 about their friend Martha and why remembering her is so important to them. Martha's mum, Bec, will also be joining us to talk to the students. The Martha Bursary Award was set up in Martha's memory to ensure that a student whose family are unable to pay the schools fees can benefit from an education at the school that Martha loved so much. Martha was someone who saw the best in everyone and the fun in everything, a quality we celebrate at Howell's.

In previous years, we have held a black-tie Champions' Dinner to raise funds for the Martha Bursary Award, and students have climbed Pen-y-Fan in her memory. With current restrictions, we have been unable to do either of these events, however this term, in Martha's memory, we will be holding the following events:

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- Walking the equivalent height of Pen-y-Fan around the school grounds, Nursery to Year 12— Friday 25th June
