Nursery

When new girls enter the Nursery, strong links are formed with the parents so that they can help their daughters settle comfortably into the environment and routines. When the girls have a birthday, parents are invited into the classroom to read a favourite story and share an event from each year of their daughter's life. Our home/school tasks each term also strengthen the links and make wonderful interactive displays in the classrooms. During the school year there are many opportunities for parents to share their experiences, occupations, cultural heritage and expertise, and we have enjoyed Indian dancing, Diwali celebrations and the Chinese New Year as well as finding out about the care of a new baby in the 'baby clinic' role play area. We offer three clubs for our Nursery girls: French, Spanish and Ballet (additional fee).

Star of the Week

Each week teaching staff nominate a girl to receive a certificate. These are awarded for non-academic attributes such as confidence, politeness and being caring, and for demonstrating one of our sixteen Habits of Mind, the qualities we look for in an effective learner.

Stepping Stones

The Stepping Stones scheme is based on The Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme and involves completing a variety of tasks in five sections: Physical, Service, Skill, Activity and Reflection. The girls are able to select the tasks they wish to complete. The tasks promote and develop composure, confidence, courage and commitment

- To encourage our girls to realise the importance of life skills from a young age.
- To encourage our girls to be the best they can be.
- To encourage our girls to improve themselves in all areas of life not just areas they are good at.

Breakfast, After School Care and Holiday Care Club (TOOT)

Breakfast Club begins at 7.45am in our Junior School Hall where a range of breakfast is available. After School Care is very popular for girls from Nursery to Year 6. The girls book their places during morning registration and have the option of a sandwich tea at an additional charge. The caring staff provide a range of exciting activities from art and craft to cooking; the older girls can use the computers to make a start on their homework. After School Care runs until 6pm.

Howell's School also runs a Holiday Care Club during most of the school holidays throughout the year. It is open to 3 - 9 year olds and their siblings, boys and girls, and provides themed activities to entertain and inspire in the familiar and secure environments of the Nursery and Reception areas as well as the Junior School Hall. The Club runs from 8am to 6pm each day, is led by Howell's teachers and Teaching Assistants and benefits from the superb facilities and beautiful grounds of the School. Stay and Play

Stay and Play is held weekly in the Junior School. It has its own designated age-appropriate equipment and offers a warm welcome and friendly faces. Open to all children from birth to four years it creates a relaxed environment where parents, grandparents and carers can drop in for play and a chat.



Stay and Swim

The weekly *Stay and Swim* sessions are open to children from six weeks to three years. They offer a warm, safe environment for little ones to experience the joys of water play and swimming under the watchful eye of a friendly professional coach.



Stay and Sing

Stay and Sing takes place in the Hub@Howell's. It offers our weekly visitors a bilingual music session (in English and Welsh) and gives opportunities for the children, parents and carers to explore, create and enjoy music, rhymes and movement in a friendly atmosphere.



LUNCHTIME AND AFTER SCHOOL CLUBS

At Howell's there is an extensive variety of activities and clubs available to reflect and develop the girls' wide range of interests. These opportunities enrich each girl's education, providing exciting and stimulating experiences which enhance individual learning. The extracurricular programme is well established, with some clubs, such as Netball and Rounders, running since 1984 when the Junior School first opened, through to the more recent additions of Junior Rock and Public Speaking to broaden their experiences and sharpen their skills.

Chess Club (additional fee)

Chess has long been regarded as a game that can have beneficial effects on children's learning, especially when it is played from a young age. It develops analytical and decision-making skills, encouraging players to analyse and visualise future possibilities. Chess Club involves a mixture of learning, discussion of tactics and taking part in organised competitions – with prizes for all! Some of our players compete at a very high level and include taking part in the Commonwealth Games and World Championships.



Coding Club

Coding Club is for Year 6 girls, running for a term. Girls are encouraged to be creative and experiment with different coding languages. We have a variety of robots that the girls can physically programme as well as PC and iPad based software where the girls can be imaginative and creative in designing their own cyber worlds and arcade-style games.



Computer Club

Computer Club helps girls to develop their computer skills including coding through a series of challenges themed around their interests, such as fashion, music and sport. Computer Club supports girls' learning in IT and across the curriculum and improves their confidence and self-esteem, as well as being a lot of fun!

Cookery Club (additional fee)

Cookery Club is an after school club offered to girls in Years 1-6. Girls have the opportunity to plan, prepare and make a range of delicious foods which they always enjoy taking home to eat.



Film Club

Film Club runs after school for girls in Years 4 and 5. Girls watch films or excerpts from films across a range of genres. Through role play and creative activities girls explore themes and review what they have seen discussing their views.

French (additional fee)

French Club offers an enjoyable and easy way to learn the language through various activities such as games, songs, crafts, stories and drama. The teaching style is fun, dynamic and interactive. It follows a progressive, well-structured course, which covers the essentials skills necessary to learn a foreign language – reading, writing, listening and speaking. The teaching is informal, creating the optimum learning conditions for the girls to build confidence in the French language.

Forest School

Forest School is a weekly after school club offered to girls in Years 2 and 3. Based in our beautiful "Green Garden", the girls have the opportunity to enjoy our school grounds in all seasons. The girls play games and explore their senses through a range of activities and develop tool skills whilst making woodland craft items.

Gardening Club

Gardening Club is a lunchtime club which gives the girls the opportunity to help with planting flowers, herbs and seasonal vegetables in school. We link with RHS school initiatives and our school gardener.

German (additional fee)

German Club gives pupils an opportunity to learn their first German words and simple phrases, through lots of different topics. The girls' learning is enhanced through stimulating and enjoyable activities, using pictures, songs and games.

Mandarin (additional fee)

Mandarin Club consists of two parts – language and traditional Chinese activities. In the language sessions, the girls learn some basic Chinese characters, how to pronounce them, and also some daily conversational phrases in Mandarin. These sessions are delivered in a creative way combining games and other group challenges. Traditional Chinese activities include mask painting, Chinese plate painting, paper cutting and calligraphy. The Mandarin Club gives the girls lots of opportunities to connect with China.

Maths Club (invitation)

The *Jaguar Cars Maths in Motion Challenge* is a motivating mathematics-based project for gifted and talented girls. The challenge uses tried and tested software that simulates the setting up of a racing car. The students encounter a variety of mathematical tasks in their attempts to win a series of races. They work together in small teams, competing against each other in an effort to win a Grand Prix style race and become U.K. Champions. The project is also accredited to the British Science Association's CREST award scheme and so during the course of the project the girls work towards achieving a bronze award.

Mindfulness Colouring Club

Drop in sessions give the girls the opportunity to sit and colour in a relaxing and calm environment at lunchtimes.



Newspaper Club (application)

Newspaper club is offered to girls in Years 2-6 who apply for the post by writing an article to demonstrate their journalistic skills. The club runs weekly after school. The girls are allocated roles such as editor and features editor and work hard to write articles about school news and current affairs. The newspaper is published half termly when it is sold to the girls and staff, with the proceeds going to charities.

Philosophy Club

Philosophy Club is an exciting lunchtime meeting where the girls are encouraged to think about and discuss a variety of interesting and relevant topics. They become more confident in voicing opinions and formulating thoughts. The girls are stimulated to listen to new and varied points of view and evaluate what is discussed. They are given the opportunity to air personal opinions and to respect opposing viewpoints within a nurturing and tolerant environment. It is always good fun and the girls could talk for hours!

RESOLVEit

At the RESOLVEit Superhero Academy girls follow the RESOLVEit personal safety superheroes to help increase their self esteem, life and self defence skills.

Girls work through interactive life skills workbooks and techniques from the self-defence syllabus. At the end of the course girls are tested on their personal safety and self defence skills through a practical assessment where they are asked to demonstrate and explain techniques to their peers. On successful completion, girls receive a certificate and a t-shirt to signify their progression onto the next part of their superhero journey.

Spaghetti Maths (additional fee)

The club delivers engaging and exciting maths enrichment activities for girls in Year 3, 4 and 5. The club aims to get girls to show interest and motivation in maths while building their confidence when working with numbers. Girls explore the mind-blowing wonder behind maths in creative activities, which stimulates their natural desire to learn.

Spanish (additional fee)

Spanish Club offers learning through games, drama and songs. The course is designed to give children confidence and enthusiasm for the Spanish language. It provides an excellent foundation for Senior School and promotes the learning of additional foreign languages too. The year culminates in a small concert, to which parents are invited and at which the children demonstrate their knowledge and understanding of the language.

Speech and Drama (additional fee)

Using poetry, acting games and scripts, girls in Speech and Drama Club learn to speak clearly, project their voices, develop their confidence and work as a team. Students have the opportunity to take LAMDA (London Academy of Music and Dramatic Art) examinations, giving them a focus for their development and a great sense of achievement.

Yoga and Relaxation Club

An introduction to yoga is a fun time for the girls to learn about keeping their mind and body healthy and the importance of staying in sync with each other. This includes chanting, asanas, magic blanky time, breathing games and meditation. They become very enthusiastic about incorporating yoga into their everyday lives and sharing their knowledge with friends and family. The girls in Year 6 can also attend a Relaxation Club giving them the opportunity to learn valuable yoga techniques to relax the mind and body when faced with new challenges.



MUSIC

Music lessons offer the opportunity for girls to experience playing new instruments, such as the violin in Year 3 and the cornet in Year 4. In addition to lessons during curriculum time, many girls request individual music tuition in instruments such as the cello, flute, drums and piano from peripatetic teachers during the school day. Singing lessons are also available from Year 4. The girls can also display their musical talent through joining one of our many lunchtime or after school clubs which are offered at different times throughout the year. Performance is an important part of music and so these clubs perform regularly in school assemblies and at concerts for parents each term.

Polished Brass

The Brass Group is open to any trumpeters, trombonists, French horn and tuba players, and is a particularly good introduction to the skills of ensemble playing for brass players.

Infant Choir

Infant Choir is a club for Year 1 and 2 girls who love to sing. Each week, the girls enjoy performing songs from a wide variety of musical genres. Singing in the Infant Choir gives the girls confidence and helps them to develop an appreciation not only for great music but also for teamwork.

Flute Choir

The Flute Choir is open to all flautists in Years 3 - 6. It is a wonderful opportunity for flute players of different abilities and ages to play together in a small group and is an ideal introduction to ensemble playing.

Junior Competition Choir (audition)

Girls from Year 4-6 audition to join this club. Those who are successful meet twice a week to rehearse for the Bi-annual GDST choir competition as well as enjoying performing together at events throughout the year.

Junior Radio

Girls work in small groups to learn how to use the school radio equipment. The girls record a short broadcast which is played to the whole school audience.

Junior Rock

Junior Rock is open to girls in Years 5 and 6 who have been playing guitar, percussion or keyboard/piano for over a year and who are particularly interested in investigating electronic music. Junior Rock members often get the chance to develop skills on other electronic instruments too. The annual instrumental concert provides an opportunity for girls to create their own music as part of a small group of up to six players.

Shake Rattle and Roll

Shake, Rattle and Roll is a percussion ensemble open to girls in Years 4 to 6 who either have percussion lessons or who are keen to improve their music reading skills rhythm while playing percussion instruments. The girls will have the opportunity to play



both pitched and non-pitched percussion and do not need to have any previous percussion playing experience. They will have the opportunity to learn to read musical notation while developing the skill of sensitive ensemble playing through listening to each other and working collaboratively.

Orchestra

The Junior Orchestra is open to girls in Years 3 - 6 who have been playing their orchestral instrument for about two terms. New members are welcomed throughout the year. The orchestra plays a variety of music from arrangements of classics to well-known 'pop' tunes. There are a range of parts with varying degrees of difficulty. The orchestra performs in our Eisteddfod, at Christmas and at the annual instrumental concert. The Junior School Orchestra provides the opportunity for girls to make music as part of a large group and to play alongside others who may be more experienced than themselves. It is wonderful to see the girls develop, not only musically, but also in confidence and leadership.



String Machine

String Machine is open to girls in Years 3 - 6 who play a string instrument. They need to have had lessons for about a term, and we accept new members throughout the year as their skills develop. We play a range of music and there are a variety of parts with varying degrees of difficulty. String Machine performs in school assemblies and concerts, providing the opportunity for girls to make music as part of a larger group but in an environment where the string instruments can be heard more easily! It is also an ideal introduction for new string players before they join the Junior School Orchestra.



Band Skills Workshops

Staff are available to offer support and guidance to groups of girls who wish to form their own bands and ensembles during this weekly lunchtime drop in session.



Stringtastic and Brasstastic

These are opportunities for any girls in Years 3 and 4 to further develop their violin and cornet playing respectively, following their class instrumental lessons.

Other Ensembles

Other ensembles are available at different times of the year depending on the girls' skills and talents. These bring together those that play other wind instruments as well as harp and guitar players.



SPORTS

Howell's recognises the importance of sport and fitness and in addition to our PE lessons we offer a wide range of lunch and after school clubs. We realise the importance of creating healthy habits during childhood and ensure that all staff are confident in delivering the PE curriculum, making it challenging, fun and rewarding. We are fortunate to have a swimming pool on site and we have specialist swimming teachers who coach all the girls from nursery to Year 6. The weekly swimming lessons develop water confidence and improve swimming technique in a safe, nurturing environment. They also provide an opportunity for the girls to have fun with their friends.

All girls in the Junior School, from Reception through to Year 6, are given the opportunity to attend a wide range of lunchtime or after-school sports clubs. Currently, over 80% of girls participate in at least one activity, developing their skills, building self-confidence and having fun. Each year we hold a School Sports Day and Swimming Gala in which every girl, from Nursery to Year 6, participates.

Athletics Club, Years 3, 4, 5 and 6

Athletics Club runs in the Summer Term for girls in Year 3, 4, 5 and 6. Following the UK Athletics *Quadkids* Award scheme, all participants work to improve their running, throwing and jumping skills, collecting certificates and badges for their achievements at the end of the programme. We also participate in the Year 5 & 6 Cardiff Schools' Quadkids competition in May and June.



Football Club, Years 3, 4, 5 and 6

(additional fee)

A popular weekly club for the younger girls run by Cardiff City Ladies Football Club. They enjoy mastering the skills of the game and playing as a team while having fun.



Hockey Club, Years 5 and 6

A Hockey Club is run for each of these age-groups after school during the Autumn and Spring Terms. This club provides the opportunity to play competitive hockey, develop skills and acquire an understanding of tactical play as well as have fun! We participate in the South Wales Girls' U11 Club Hockey League, which takes place once a month, on a Sunday, as well as regular fixtures with local schools, the latter principally in the Autumn Term.



Kwik Cricket, Year 6

Cricket is one of our newer clubs. The girls learn the skills of the game and compete in matches against local schools.

Lacrosse Club, Years 5 and 6

This popular club runs currently as a lunch-time activity. The girls learn the skills of lacrosse through a modified five-a-side, non-contact version of the game, using plastic sticks and soft balls. We enter local tournaments held in the Spring and Summer Terms, including the Welsh Pop Lacrosse Championships held annually in South Wales.



Netball Club, Years 3, 4, 5 and 6

Netball clubs for Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 offer girls the opportunity to learn and develop their netball skills. Each session involves fun training drills, ball skills and match play. The girls also have the opportunity to represent the school in competitive matches against other schools and in city-wide tournaments.



Rounders Club, Years 5 and 6

Rounders Club runs throughout the Summer Term, with separate sessions for Years 5 and 6. Matches are played against local Independent Schools in both age groups.



Running Club, Years 5 and 6

Running Club offers opportunities for girls wishing to develop their speed stamina and overall fitness level. This popular club takes place during the lunch break and includes relays and individual running activities over a range of distances. Girls from this club participate in the Cardiff Schools' Cross-Country Championships in the Autumn Term.



Sports Club, Years 3 and 4

Year 3 and 4 Sports Club enables girls to study sports in greater depth than is possible in lesson time. Girls play modified versions of team and individual sports throughout the year, with an emphasis on netball, hockey, tennis and rounders, building competence and confidence whilst learning the importance of co-operation and competition. We compete against local independent schools in netball, hockey and rounders in Year 3 and Year 4 and enter the South Wales Mini Red Tennis Competition held during the Summer Term.



Swimming Team (additional fee)

This is an 'invitation only' club for swimmers to prepare together as a team to compete in galas spread throughout the school year. Girls build stamina and refine all four competitive strokes, practise competition diving, relay techniques, turns and finishes.



Ballet, Street Dance and Jazz Clubs

(additional fee)

Our dance clubs are a wonderful way for the girls to become active and develop their physical coordination skills, strength and concentration. They are also great fun and are a lovely way to improve fitness across the whole body. Ballet classes start in the Nursery and the graceful, magical and enchanting activities are very popular with girls well into the Juniors. The Street Dance and Jazz Clubs teach jazz and urban dance moves to the latest dance tunes and are very popular with girls from Year 1 to Year 6. The routines are progressive and incorporate a mixture of hip hop and street dance moves taught at a fun, steady pace. Girls from Nursery to Year 6 have the opportunity to undertake examinations in ballet.



Synchronised Swimming

(invitation)

This club is available to experienced swimmers in Year 6. The girls learn basic synchronised swimming skills and techniques and are then involved in the choreography of a routine which is filmed and shown in assembly. They perform at our swimming gala with their latest routine each year.



Tag Rugby Club, Years 4 and 5

The girls learn the rules, practise drills, develop skills and build up to playing the game on the school field. We take part in the Cardiff Schools' Tag Rugby tournament every year and have also hosted our own Tag Rugby tournament.



Tennis Club, Years 5 and 6

Tennis Clubs run in the Summer Term for girls in Years 5 and 6. They build on skills learned in lesson time and, as they progress, girls develop their knowledge of the game, playing mini-tennis. The school enters the Cardiff County and South Wales Tennis Championships at Mini Red, Orange and Green levels. We also have fixtures with local schools.



SPECIAL EVENTS

Charity Days

We have one charity day per term which is usually a non-uniform day. Groups of girls nominate themselves to organise a stall such as selling cakes or a raffle and they raise money for their own designated charity. This gives the girls experience of planning and preparing a stall, selling their produce, compromising and working as a team to succeed. It also raises awareness of charities and their importance in our local community. All girls in Key Stage 2 have a chance to participate if they wish to do so.



Concerts

All our girls have the opportunity to perform for their parents and friends throughout the year. This promotes confidence which is reflected in their everyday school life. It also gives them the opportunity to work as a team and enhance their musical, dramatic, social and presentation skills. Our productions involve lighting, sound and staging effects to produce high quality and enjoyable performances of which the girls and their parents are rightly proud.



Eisteddfod

On or around March 1st every year we celebrate St David's Day and hold our own Eisteddfod. The girls take part in competitions to win points for their school houses and these include instrumental, creative, handwriting, cookery, communal choir and creative writing tasks. The whole school comes together to perform different items, share their wonderful achievements and hear the results from invited judges. The day culminates in the Chiring of the Bard ceremony and the presentation of the cup to the winning house.



Girls Do Stay in Touch

Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 have established excellent links with our sister GDST school, The Royal High School Bath in a project called 'Girls Do Stay in Touch'. The girls regularly write to one another and send each other letters, drawings, photos, class books and even video conference. We were delighted to invite the girls to join us for a day and share our lessons with a teddy bears picnic lunch.



Residential Trips

Year 4 enjoy a one-night residential trip to Bath, to enhance their learning of 'Romans' topic. Year 5 have a two-night residential trip to Plymouth, which provides an opportunity for the girls to bond before entering their last year in the Junior School. It also links to their Tudor topic, enabling them to walk in the footsteps of Francis Drake. Year 6 go to Storey Arms in the Brecon Beacons for an exciting week-long residential trip. The challenge of outdoor pursuits and lots of laughter builds their self-confidence and develops team building and leadership qualities. It is definitely the highlight of their year!



Swimming Gala

All of the girls enjoy taking part in an exciting annual gala; the Key Stage 1 gala is held in the school pool; while the Key Stage 2 is held at the International Pool in Cardiff Bay, where the parents are invited as spectators. The girls represent their houses and take part in several races, earning valuable house points, and have the chance of winning a medal; the overall winning team wins a house trophy. The synchronised swimming team perform at the interval.



Visitors

We are lucky to attract a variety of visitors to the school to inspire the girls. Recently the girls have talked to a Paralympics champion, Olympic gold medallist sailor Hannah Mills (an Old Girl of the school), Richard Parks, Cathy Cassidy, plus parents and family members who have experiences appropriate to the topics being studied.



PUPIL VOICE

Eco Committee

The Eco Committee is made up of girls in Reception - Year 6, led by our Year 6 Eco Prefects. The girls meet regularly to plan different eco events in school as well as raising awareness to other girls about ecological issues. The committee supports the national Eco Schools Programme, looking at nine main topics: water, biodiversity, energy, global perspectives, healthy living, litter, the school grounds, transport and waste.



Fairtrade

Fairtrade is a group which allows girls to discuss tactics on how to make the world a fairer place. There are two 'Fairtrade Fortnights' a year, when the girls organise a stall selling Fairtrade goods and raise awareness of Fairtrade through assemblies. They also experience 'committee style' breakfast meetings with the Senior School Fairtrade members, at which they enjoy Fairtrade orange juice and pastries while discussing Fairtrade plans for the school.



School Council

'The Pupil's Voice' – the Junior School has an active School Council with one representative from each class from Reception to Year 6. The weekly meetings are led by the Year 6 School Council prefects, who prepare an agenda, take minutes and provide feedback. Many issues are discussed; these are often collected via suggestion boxes around the school and the girls are nominated to take action for example by meeting the Head Teacher or writing a letter. The issues tackled recently have included designing the school playground, changing school lunches and organising charity days.



Wellbeing Committee

Girls are selected from Reception to Year 6 to represent their class. They meet regularly to discuss initiatives that support the well-being of their peers and promote healthy schools initiative. They have worked on joint projects with the School Nurse and Well-being Champion and lead assemblies throughout the year.
